City of Cleveland EMS Graduation Ceremony

CLEVELAND – On Monday, December 10, 2012 at 1:00 pm in Cleveland City Council Chambers, the Division of Emergency Medical Service will graduate 50 EMTs and Paramedics from the EMT Cadet Training Academy. The graduates will continue intensive training on the ambulance with field training officers for several weeks.

The additional staffing provided by these graduates will increase the number of ambulances to handle medical emergencies from 15 to 18 in order to meet the ever-increasing demands for service twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. We anticipate the increase in ambulances to happen no later than mid-January.
