Composting yard waste and food is a great disposal option for recycling, plant nutrients, saving landfill space, reducing disposal cost, helping the environment and it is rich in nutrients. This process is used in gardens, landscaping, horticulture, and agriculture.

The compost itself is beneficial for land in many ways, including:

- A soil conditioner.
- A fertilizer to add vital humus or humic acids.
- A natural pesticide for soil.

In eco-systems, compost is useful for:

- Erosion control.
- Land and stream reclamation.
- Wetland construction.
